Attendance

Students have the right to a free and appropriate public education, but they assume the responsibility to attend regularly and on time. Parents/guardians are responsible for the attendance of their children within the compulsory attendance age, 6 to 16. Parents have the responsibility to inform the school of their child's absences and to explain the cause of each absence. Learn more about Florida State Statues, Part II, School Attendance.

Regular and punctual school attendance is crucial for a student's academic success. The research findings make a clear case for engaging families to reduce chronic absenteeism. Good attendance habits begin at home with the right messages from parents and caregivers.

Why It Matters

Children don't show up for school regularly, they miss out on fundamental reading and math skills and the chance to build a habit of good attendance that will carry them into college and careers.

The good news is that when students attend school regularly, they can see outsized literacy gains.

Attendance Standard

- All students are required to be on time and present each day school is open during the school year.
- Students may not be absent from school without permission of the principal/ designee.
- The school principal or designee is the only person authorized to excuse a student's absence.
- A note from a parent/guardian is a request that a student's absence be excused.
- A pattern of non-attendance is, missing 10% to 19% or more of school, whether the absences are excused or not. At such time the principal shall refer the student to the Attendance Review Committee to determine if early patterns

- of truancy are developing and identify root causes. An intervention plan will be put in place to identify potential remedies and improve the student's attendance.
- For enforcement of school attendance purposes, unless acceptable documentation is submitted, an accumulation of daily unexcused absences that equal five (5) days in a calendar month or ten (10) days within a ninety (90) calendar day period, may be exhibiting a pattern of non-attendance as determined by the Attendance Review Committee.
- If the student exceeds the ten (10) parent/guardian notes in a school year, principals may request additional documentation for subsequent absences. (School Board Policy 4.16).
- Chronic tardiness is defined as six (6) or more tardies to school or to an individual class per quarter.

Make Up Work

A student who is absent and the absence is determined to be an excused absence, as defined by School Board Policy 4.16, is required to make up all course work missed. It is the student's responsibility to obtain assignments from the appropriate teacher(s) upon returning to class immediately following an absence. The student will be given the number of days absent plus one additional day to make up all work missed for full credit.

At Cape Coral High School, our goal every school year is to ensure that every student attends school regularly. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school—regardless of the reason – it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is chronically absent—which means missing 18 or more days over the course of an entire school year.

Clearly going to school regularly matters! We don't want your child to fall behind in school and get discouraged. Please ensure that your child attends school every day and arrives on time. Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your children keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before. Ensure your students go to school every day unless they are truly sick
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session.
- Talk to teachers and counselors for advice if your children feel anxious about going to school.
- Develop back up plans for getting to school if something comes up.
- Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.

2023-2024 SAT and ACT Testing Schedule

Registration deadlines are approximately a month before the test. Students can use concordant scores for graduation requirements when it comes to the FSA ELA or Algebra 1.

- **SAT:** 8/26/23, 10/7/23, 11/4/23, 12/2/23, 3/9/24, 5/4/24, and 6/1/24
- **ACT:** 9/9/23, 10/28/23, 12/9/23, 2/10/24, 4/13/24, 6/8/24, and 7/13/24

Parents or Guardians of a student with an active Individual Education Plan (IEP) or 504 plan, did you know that your student is able to apply for their IEP or 504 accommodations on the upcoming SAT, AP and ACT exams? If you are interested in starting this process, please contact your student's counselor.



Counseling Department

- 1. The **FAFSA** is a free application for Federal Student Aid that is used to determine students' eligibility for post-secondary financial aid. We encourage all of our seniors to complete this application to see if they qualify for financial assistance to help pay for college or a technical program. The website is: https://fafsa.gov/
- 2. The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA), administers a variety of state-funded grants and scholarships to assist Florida residents with the cost of their postsecondary education. This Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) can be submitted at: http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/home/ uamain.htm. Completing this application serves several purposes, including student application for all the various levels of the Bright Futures Scholarship. For more information regarding each respective level and its requirements please go to: http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/ssfad/bf/. Students need to attain a certain GPA, SAT/ACT test scores, and community service hours to qualify for the various levels of the Bright Futures Scholarship. They should meet with their counselor to discuss submitting service hours.

Both the FAFSA and FFAA applications open October 1st. Please reach out to your student's counselor if you have any questions or concerns.
